- Pennsylvania AFL-CIO ***Billy Bus Tour***

The Pennsylvania AFL-CIO *Billy Bus Tour* kicked off on Thursday, September 11<sup>th</sup> and ran through October 2<sup>nd</sup> covering 40 Labor 2008 events and activities throughout

PA, generating additional energy and enthusiasm and enlisting more volunteers support for Labor endorsed candidates up and down the ticket.

- The bus resumed its second tour of the state on Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup> and went non-stop through Election Day in Eastern and Western Pennsylvania.
- **Voter Turnout** – Approximately 1 in 3 votes cast on election day were from union households representing 30 percent of the total votes for Barack Obama in this historically high turnout of voters on Election Day. The makeup of union households includes both active and retired union members, *Working America* members and the families of union members which comprise a universe of 1.5 million people.
- **Other key facts about organized labors' accomplishments:** Since mid-August, according to AFL-CIO polling, support for Sen. Barack Obama among union members increased dramatically in Pennsylvania as the AFL-CIO grassroots mobilization gained in intensity.
  - In Pennsylvania Obama's support rose 16 percentage points for a 68 percent to 24 percent advantage.
  - 86 percent of Sen. Hillary Clinton's supporters in Pennsylvania voted for Sen. Barack Obama.
